1. The ability, capacity, and skill of the Bidder to perform the Contract or provide the services required. **Dennis Anderson Construction Corporation (hereinafter, "the Contractor") has satisfactorily performed the service required in the specifications for Calvert County Government and other entities, as evidenced through reference checks.**
2. Whether the Bidder can perform the Contract or provide the service promptly, or within the time specified, without delay or interference. **The Contractor has provided the service promptly, or within the time specified, without delay, or interference for Calvert County Government and other entities as evidenced through reference checks.**
3. The character, integrity, reliability, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the Bidder. **The Contractor has satisfactorily provided services in the past for Calvert County Government and other entities as evidenced through reference checks attesting to their character, integrity, reliability, reputation, judgment, experience, and efficiency.**
4. The quality of performance of previous contracts or services. **The Contractor has provided satisfactory work for Calvert County Government and on contracts held with other entities, as evidenced through reference checks.**
5. The previous and current compliance by the Bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the Contract. **The Contractor has complied with laws and ordinances in performing work for Calvert County Government and other entities, as evidenced through reference checks.**
6. Whether the Bidder is in arrears to Calvert County Government on any debt or contract, is in default on any surety to Calvert County Government or is delinquent as to any taxes or assessments. **The Contractor is not in arrears to Calvert County Government nor the Maryland State Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT) on any debt or contract.**
7. Any other information that may have a bearing on the decision to award the Contract. **The Contractor has no Calvert County Government zoning violations, and a Maryland judiciary case search revealed no cases which would be a cause for concern and no judgments or liens. Reference checks provided satisfactory comments.**
