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SUMMARY

The Sausalito Police Department is prepared to address the Sausalito City Council with an update to the Waterfront Management Plan.

BACKGROUND

On June 20, 2017, the Sausalito Police Department presented a Management Plan for the Sausalito Waterfront to the City Council. This plan called for the hiring of part-time staff to work in conjunction with the full time staff of the Sausalito Police Department to more effectively manage the Sausalito Waterfront.

The Waterfront Management Plan called on continued cooperation and partnership between the Sausalito Police Department, the Marin County Sheriff's Office, and the Richardson Bay Regional Agency to provide police services, enforce applicable laws, and regulate/manage the Sausalito Waterfront.

MANAGEMENT PLAN PRIORITIES:

Sausalito Police Marine Patrol staff were to continue to work through the following priorities in the waters of Sausalito.

Highest Priorities:

- 1) Removal of marine debris vessels
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- 2) Removal of unoccupied vessels used as storage
- 3) Unregistered vessels
- 4) Vessels occupied by persons who are a danger to themselves or others

Lowest Priority:

- 1) Occupied vessels that are:
 - a. Licensed
 - b. Registered
 - c. In possession of a waste disposal contract or utilizing similar form of service

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

Since May 22, 2018, the following has taken place as part of the Waterfront Management Plan:

STAFFING:

The Sausalito Police Department is still recruiting for the part-time positions of Marine Patrol Officer and Harbor Assistant authorized in June of 2017. Since the last update, a retired Law Enforcement Officer from Marin County with extensive Maritime Law Enforcement experience has been contacted regarding the Marine Patrol Officer position. He is considering the position and we will be holding additional discussions about the position. The retired law enforcement officer who is interested in the Harbor Assistant position is conferring with CalPers to determine if the conditions of his industrial retirement would allow him to take the job.

USCG ABANDONED/DERELICT VESSEL WORKGROUP:

On June 20, 2018, Lieutenant Fraass attended the Abandoned/Derelict Vessel Workgroup and provided them with a brief update regarding the City of Sausalito's efforts regarding its Waterfront Management Plan.

RICHARDSON BAY REGIONAL AGENCY MONTHLY MEETINGS:

Sausalito Police Department personnel have been attending the monthly Richardson Bay Regional Agency Board meetings as observers. For the last several months, the Richardson Bay Regional Agency has been working on developing a plan for accommodating vessels upon Richardson Bay. Initial plans being discussed would include a mooring ball field and regulations for those vessels utilizing the moorings.

SAUSALITO WATERFRONT WORKING GROUP:

On June 20, 2018, the Sausalito Waterfront Working Group held a meeting regarding the progress of the City's Waterfront Management Plan. During this meeting, the

Working Group also discussed the plans the Richardson Bay Regional Agency has been considering regarding the development of a possible mooring field on Richardson Bay.

MEDIA:

Since May 22, 2018, KCBS News and KTVU News did stories regarding Sausalito's efforts upon our waterways and the City's Waterfront Management Plan. These news stories showed Sausalito's actions in a positive light.

ENFORCEMENT

Since May 22, 2018, the Sausalito Police Department has abated one (1) unoccupied marine debris vessels. The abated marine debris vessels were:
